ARTSTATE TAMWORTH

JOIN THE CONVERSATION AND CELEBRATE THE ARTS IN REGIONAL NSW



WOW!! Artstate **Tamworth** - what a great event for our region! Arts North West was front of stage in the arts program, and many of our artists and artsworkers were part of panels in the Speaker's Program. Arts North West will send out an overview document shortly with more information.

The highlight for Arts North West was the exhibition *Art Word Place* which celebrated the writers and artists from our region.



The Art Connections Arts Trail and Open Weekend was a great weekend of arts, community and connection held over 31 October to 4 November. Over 60 venues from small studios, shop fronts and regional galleries registered to take part in this creative journey through our region. 20,000 copies of the directory were distributed throughout the region and to all **12 LGAs**. This project was funded by the Federal Government's Building Better Regions fund.

Arts North West is assisted by the NSW Government through Create NSW and the partnership of twelve local government authorities in the New England North West.

ABORIGINAL CULTURAL SUPPORT PROGRAM

SUPPORT, ADVICE AND ASSISTANCE FOR ABORIGINAL ARTISTS AND COMMUNITIES



It has been a very busy quarter in the Aboriginal Cultural Support Program, with some projects finishing, and others starting.

Participants in *Create the Curator* (professional development program for emerging regional Aboriginal curators in **Tamworth** and **Moree**) travelled to Sydney for workshops with Arts Law, Regional Arts NSW and exclusive tours at the Australian Museum and Museum of Contemporary Art. (Funded by Create NSW)

The Yesterday Today Tomorrow project moved to **Moree**, with filming of Aunty Noeline Briggs-Smith as the lead Elder and dancer Paul Spearim. A small display was held at UNE Peel House during Artstate Tamworth.



Major exhibitions will take place at the Moree Dhiiyaan Centre in December, **Inverall** Art Gallery in February 2020 and Ray Walsh House **Tamworth** in May 2020. (Funded by Federal Government Indigenous Language and the Arts Program)

We were successful with the submission to the Australia Council for the Arts: Yinaar: A Creative Exploration of Aboriginal Women's Business in the *New England North West.* The project has a strong foundation of cultural protocols and consultation and is informed by documented research into traditional women's business and storytelling. Under the guidance of Aunty Yvonne Kent, Lorrayne Riggs will travel throughout our region, to all 12 LGAs.



In August, the artists for Miyay Miyay (7 Sisters) met at Wallabadah for a three-day residency. The work – a production based on the Gomeroi version of the Seven Sisters Songline – is being developed for a small regional tour next year to Moree, Narrabri, **Tamworth** and **Armidale**. There was also a work in progress presentation as part of Artstate **Tamworth** in October. (Funded by Creative Koori and Regional Arts Fund).





ARTS NW ON TOUR

PERFORMING ARTS NETWORK

Mike Burge attended the Performing Arts Exchange in Caloundra to source productions for 2020 and beyond. He also attended Theatre Network NSW's Indy Theatre Forum and presented at SALON for Arts on Tour, both as part of artstate Tamworth.

Productions around the region this quarter included: Roald Dahl's The Twits toured to Narrabri, Glen Innes, Bingara, Armidale, Gunnedah, Quirindi, and **Tamworth** in August. *Sunset Strip* played at Quirindi, Gunnedah and **Inverell** in October, and *You'll never* guess where I hid the Cheese toured to Quirindi, Gunnedah and Bingara also in October.

MINISTERIAL APPOINTMENTS

TO STATE ARTFORM ADVISORY BOARDS

Create NSW has undergone a review of its funding programs, and all applications will now be assessed by an artform-specific Advisory Board rather than a cross-sector panel of peers. Artform Advisory Boards have been made up of artform leaders and representatives from the broader sector to improve transparency and ensure greater confidence in decision-making processes.
