ENABLE ARTS NETWORK

ARTS AND DISABILITY PROJECTS

Our Enable Arts Network which is focused on providing creative opportunities to artists with a disability will be returning to the forefront of Arts North West programming in 2020. We are in the process of finalising two exciting new projects that will be rolled out towards the middle of the year.



We will be welcoming back Sprung *Integrated Dance Company* from the Northern Rivers, to Inverell and **Armidale**. In *Make it Rain*, participants will create a work on a blank umbrella that will then be used as a prop in a dance workshop. After the workshop, the umbrellas will then be installed in Armidale Regional Airport.




The second project, Sketchbook Library, will give artists with and without a disability the opportunity to create their own body of work within a sketchbook. Participants can have the sketchbook mailed to them or take part in one of a series of creative workshops throughout the region.

The sketchbooks will then tour around the region's libraries including Narrabri, Shire, Gunnedah Shire, Gwydir Shire, Liverpool Plains Shire, Tamworth Regional, Uralla Shire, and Walcha Council.

ABORIGINAL CULTURAL SUPPORT PROGRAM

SUPPORT, ADVICE AND ASSISTANCE FOR ABORIGINAL ARTISTS AND COMMUNITIES



The Yinaar project has begun with considerable consultation and the development of protocols under the direction of an Aboriginal Steering Committee chaired by Aunty Yvonne Kent.

Finishing touches were completed on the Yesterday Today Tomorrow project in preparation for its exhibition tour to **Inverell** (13 February to 17 March) Moree (26 March to 20 April) and Tamworth (4 May to 2 June).

Arts North West is assisted by the NSW Government through Create NSW and the partnership of twelve local government authorities in the New England North West.

Deepwater: Deepwater Progress Association Inc: Woodfired Raku Kiln Workshop A 2-day workshop on history of Raku, glaze making for woodfired Raku pottery firing in steel rubbish bin kilns.

Quirindi: Quirindi Preschool Kindergarten Incorporated: Biochrome – Children, Nature, Art and Science Collaboration

Artist Dr Renata Buziak will conduct a 3-day workshop. Educators, children and families will explore one of the earliest historical photographic processes: the cyanotype.

Armidale: New England Regional Art Museum: Winter Blooming Festival Winter Blooming is a festival that celebrates Indigenous, multicultural and LGBTIQ arts, culture and communities. The festival is an inclusive event that supports diversity and it open to all occurrence.

Armidale: New England Writers' Centre: Leaf, Stone, Beetle: Storytelling through metaphor and visual narrative

Presented by multi-award-winning author Ursula Dubosarsky and publisher Margrete Lamond, this imaginative, innovative project involves a community workshop, public talk, and school presentations.

Gunnedah: Arts Gunnedah Inc: Artist Workshops to be held during the year of the 50th Annual Art Exhibition Celebration in 2020 Visual art workshops will assist beginners, and experienced artists in all mediums and of all ages to learn new skills and come together to facilitate learning and encourage community involvement.

Moree: Bank Art Museum Moree: The Painted River Project

Two professional artists will lead an "en plein air" workshop at the Gwydir Wetlands in Moree in collaboration with University of Western Sydney, local Moree artists and the Local Lands Services in April 2020. Artworks will be exhibited as part of the BAMM Art Fair 2020.

Glen Innes: Glen Innes Pottery Club: "Precious Flora"

Glen Innes Pottery Club will host ceramic artist Dr Cathy Franzi for a workshop where participants will visit World Heritage National Parks, gather inspiration from the precious environment, learn new ceramic techniques and exhibit work at the local Agricultural Show.

OUT AND ABOUT

CONVERSATIONS, NEWS, NETWORKING, SKILLS

The Executive Director continues to work with **Walcha** Council on developing their Public Art Policy and has been attending the **Inverell** Arts in Health Working Group. She developed and facilitated a workshop on Art Handling and Installation to **Narrabri** Shire Council in November.

Caroline also attended the Classical Music Artform Advisory Board meeting and the Regional Arts Development Organisation Network meeting, both in Sydney in November. These events allow for Caroline to network and advocate on behalf of the arts and cultural sector in our region.

Finally Caroline has been in discussions with State agencies and the Creative Recovery Network to assist our creative community with bushfire and drought recovery.

COMMUNITY CAPACITY BUILDING, NETWORKS

We are delighted to partner with the University of New England this year to bring some professional development workshops to the region. These workshops will build capacity for our region's communiy and cultural development and provide opportunities for local creatives. Keep an eye out for the wonderful Monica Davidson from Creative Plus Business who will be coming through the region (Tamworth, Armidale, Inverell) in May.

Arts North West on Tour continues to negotiate touring product throughout the region Fifteen performances are planned in the first six months of 2020 in venues in **Armidale**, **Gunnedah**, **Glen Innes**, **Inverell**, **Narrabri**, **Quirindi**, **Tamworth** and **Tenterfield**. Shows booked are *What's New Pussy Cat*, *Hell Ship* and the *Melbourne Comedy Festival Roadshow*.

The artstate exhibition *Art Word Place* which promoted artists and writers from all our **12 LGAs** will be touring to **Armidale** and **Moree** in the first half of the year.
