These projects are on top of other ANW initiatives which continue to be rolled out this year. This includes the two major community arts projects-*The Panorama Project* (sketchbooks that have documented COVID-19 in the NENW - www.artsnw.com.au/panorama-project) and *Captain Isobolt and the Great Covid Crises of 2020* (a set of 5 short videos engaging community theatre practitioners in the NENW). www.artsnw.com.au/captain-isobolt.

Both these projects have involved artists in all our LGAs, providing many opportunities for creative networking.

We have a great year ahead, we hope to see you all out safely at arts and cultural event in the NENW.

ARTS RESTART FUNDING A MYRIAD OF CREATIVE PROJECTS

The Arts Restart Funding from Create NSW will include the following projects:

1. ANW Connect

Employing 12 "creative champions" in each of our regions who will work with creative practitioners and arts venues to promote and sell their work. We will also be employing 12 local photographers who will be tasked in documenting the many arts events that are happening in our area.

2. Enable arts (arts and disability)
Sprung! Integrated Dance and
Theatre will deliver performances and
workshops in **Inverell** and **Armidale**working alongside some of our key arts
and disability community groups.

- 3. Aboriginal Cultural Support Program "Bawi-li" a duo of Aboriginal female singer songwriters from **Tamworth**—Loren Ryan and Quarralia Knox writing and recording 6 new songs and performing in **Wee Waa**, **Wallhallow**, **Toomelah**, **Mungindi**.
- 4. Roundtables and Residencies
 These two projects focus on a key
 feature of ANW's programs- the cross
 fertilisation and networking across
 artforms.
- "Looking Both Ways"
 A series of creative roundtables —
 bringing together 30 visual artists and
 writers from **across the NENW** to study
 creative inspiration and the interplay of
 text and image.
- "In the Museum"
 A set of 5 residencies in small volunteer museums in our region – in Narrabri,

Tenterfield, Gunnedah, Armidale and **Glen Innes.** A local artist (from any artform) will be embedded in these museums to work with their collections, and to develop new work for exhibition. As part of this residency, they will also deliver a workshop for the community.

Arts North West is partnering with Tamworth Regional Council to deliver the **Manilla** Micro Music Festival which will bring together a range of local musicians drawn from across the Tamworth LGA and greater region for a relaxed music gathering over a Friday night and Saturday afternoon in April 2021. Covering all contemporary styles from jazz to country to blues, there will be at least 12 performance spots for local singer-songwriters and musicians.

Arts North West is assisted by the NSW Government through Create NSW and the partnership of twelve local government authorities in the New England North West.

SUCCESSFUL PROJECTS

The following projects were successful with their grant applications for the Country Arts Support Program in 2021

Armidale NE Writers Centre: *Prepare* to Self Publish

Workshops for self-publishing authors on editing, designing and creating the professional print-ready file for their book as well as marketing and promotion.

Gunnedah Dorothea Mackellar Memorial Society Incorporated: *Slam Poetry Workshops*

Miles Merrill, slam performance writer from Word Travels, based in Sydney, will conduct a writing and performance workshop for secondary school students from Gunnedah High School and Barraba Central School.

Gunnedah Winanga-Li: *Create Gunnedah High*

A public art project at the local high school using 18 concrete planters around the school grounds.

Narrabri Narrabri Shire Council: *CREATE* - *An Art and Culture Event*

An annual event "CREATE" which will include art, film, music and lights, with following years seeing more activities added to increase diversification.

Bingara Gwydir Shire Council: *Print Making Workshop*

A drypoint printing workshop will run for two days out of the Living Classroom in Bingara.

Armidale New England Regional Art Museum: *Artist Residency Program* Two funded residencies to NSW-based artists to engage in creative and professional development utilising NERAM's Packsaddle Residence and the Museum of Printing.
