


The Panorama Project continues on its merry way.

ARTS RESTART FUNDING

ACTIVATING OUR REGION



ANW CONNECT: Twelve people were employed as Creative Champions on a short 3 month contract in each LGA. They are supporting artists and arts organisations to connect into ANW online cultural registry. 9 more people have been employed as Snaphot photographers to document 3-4 events across the 12 LGAs from March-December 2021. ANW has also sponsored the Regional Music Officer position - Sarah Leete from Baan Baa was appointed to the 4 day a week role.

ENABLE ARTS: Accessible Arts delivered an online (all LGAs) "Disability Confidence Training" to ensure inclusive access to people with disability. An absolute highlight was the visit from five dancers and choreographers from the Sprung!



Integrated Dance Theatre based in Ballina to do dance/expressive performance workshops for people with disability on 26 March in Inverell, and 27 March in Armidale. We had a huge turnout in Inverell and it was memorable for participants and facilitators alike.

ROUNDTABLES & RESIDENCIES: A very busy component of our projects this quarter. Looking Both Ways was a set of two creative roundtables for 21 writers and artists from all 12 LGAs. Facilitated by writer Sophie Masson and painter Angus Nivison participants were combined in pairs (and one trio) to collaborate in their own media/creative practice with each other on a shared topic, exploring a creative thread together.



In the Museum placed 5 artists/writers/musicians in community museums (Hillgrove, Emmaville, Tenterfield, Wee Waa, Gunnedah) to respond to the collections. Resident creatives from Armidale, Deepwater, Tenterfield, Baan Baa and Gunnedah.

ABORIGINAL CULTURAL SUPPORT PROGRAM: "Bawi-li" - a duo of Aboriginal female singer songwriters from Tamworth – Loren Ryan and Quarralia Knox wrote and recorded 6 new songs. Unfortunately their tour was postponed due to the floods but it has been resheduled for May/June (with three extra venues added!) Wee

Waa, Wallhallow, Toomelah, Moree, Tingha, Walcha, Tenterfield.

MANILLA MICRO MUSIC

SUCCESSFUL PROJECTS



Friday and Saturday 9/10 April saw the **Manilla** Town Hall come alive with the Manilla Micro Music Festival. This was supported by Create NSW Arts Restart funding and delivered in collaboration with Tamworth Regional Council.

A superb line-up of local musicians performed and for many this was their first gig since COVID-19 shut down their work. We heard everything from country, rock, pop to jazz. Thanks to the production crew and staff from TRC that made everything work so smoothly.

ANW CREATIVE INITIATIVES



The exhibition *Art Word Place* was shown at the Dixson Library at UNE in **Armidale** in early February.

Professional Development workshops went back face-to-face. In March we supported **Tamworth** Regional Gallery with its museum skills workshops which were presented by Tegan Anthes, a professional conservator with over 25 years expertise in adapting collaborating and applying conservation principles within the smallest budgets.

Also in March we welcomed back Monica Davidson from Creative Plus Business who delivered 5 workshops in the region – What's it Worth
how to value and charge for
your work (Gunnedah and Inverell),
Being Well – balancing wellbeing and
mental health with our creative practice
(Tamworth and Armidale). Monica also
facilitated Better Brainstorming for the
NENW Cultural Leaders Network, held
in Armidale.



Finally Caroline spent a day in **Bingara** with the Old Courthouse gallery, delivering the *ANW Art Handling and Installation workshop*.

And of course more planned for the year- the team is heading out to **Torringon**, **Drake**, **Tingha** and **Ashford** with artist Lizzie Horne in August.
