
ARTS AND DISABIILTY PROJECTS



The Panorama Project is finishing up after visiting Narrabri, Wee Waa, Moree, Mungindi, Warialda, Bingara, Barraba and Manilla. The final venue is Quirindi Library 4-13 Aug 2021 before the sketchbooks are returned to their owners. The State Library of NSW is interested in acquiring around 20 of the books for its permanent collection so there will a small slice of the New England North West represented in the national collection.

#### ABORIGINAL CULTURAL SUPPORT PROGRAM

SUPPORT, ADVICE AND ASSISTANCE FOR ABORIGINAL ARTISTS AND COMMUNITIES



Two creative residencies have been completed in Wallabadah and **Trelawney Station** as part of the *Yinaar* project- the exploration of Aboriginal Women's Practices in the New England North West.

Five Aboriginal artists from Inverell, Wallabadah, Tamworth and Glen **Innes** have been sharing knowledge with two Elders, and developing ideas and concepts for their artwork which will be exhibited in Moree, Tamworth and Armidale from October this year.



An e-manual has been developed to deliver an Aboriginal Arts Market. www.artsnw.com.au/anw-eresources. This is a useful tool for venues to plan and deliver arts markets in our region. We have also secured funding from the Federal Government to run the inaugural Gather and Trade art market in **Tamworth** in November.

We were successful with our Indigenous Visual Arts Industry Support grant (Federal Government) which will continue to fund the ANW Aboriginal Arts Officer position to support Aboriginal arts and cultural development across our 12 LGAs.



Our Miyaay Miyaay film project (a new creative work based on the Gamilaroi version of the Seven Sisters songline) was recorded in Moree and Tamworth in early June. Developed by Creative Director Cathy Craigie, the film focuses on Gamilaroi women and included the dance elements from in the young girls' dance group Yulugi Miramali, led by Shae Duncan and choreographed by Katie Leslie.

The film is now in its editing stage with plans for its launch late in 2021.



### **RESIDENCIES** CREATE NSW ARTS RESTART PROJECTS



Warp and Weft was an artist residency undertaken by young weaver/painter Maisie Johnson, who worked at the Bank Art Museum Moree and also spent time with local Elder, Aunt Paula Duncan.

Maisie completed a large woven piece within the Museum and delivered a free community weaving workshop.



Reverse was a cross artform collaboration between New England Regional Art Museum and New England Conservatorium of Music in Armidale. It provided four residency opportunities for local female artists and musicians to respond to the programs and collections of two of Armidale's leading cultural institutions.





Our ED has visited and provided advice to Red Chief LALC in Gunnedah, judged the Narrabri Show, supported the Armidale Cultural Centre and Keeping Place in strategic planning and collection valuation, attended Glen **Innes** Public Art committee meetings, and Tamworth Regional Council arts and culture committee meetings, hosted Create NSW visit to Armidale, Tamworth, Gunnedah and Glen Innes. Caroline chairs the Armidale Regional Council Cultural Heritage Arts and Culture Committee and has been providing input to ARC's Tourism Strategy and Public Art Policy.

The ED also assessed applications to the State Government's Classical Music Artform Advisory Board in Sydney in May.
